

- Current state of downtown
- Conditions causing need for redevelopment
- · Create a vision: what can Woodbury be longterm?
- Implementation actions during 5-year designation
- Desired businesses downtown

GOAL >> to help the city obtain DCA's Rural Zone designation



Benefits of the Rural Zone



- Up to 10 zones designated per year
- 5-year designation
- Tax credits for: job creation, investment, and rehabilitation
- · Eligibility based on:
 - Pop. < 15,000
 - Concentration of historic buildings
 - Economic "distress"
- Credits can be combined with each other, but job creation is the basis for claiming credits
- A **strategic plan** is one requirement of the application

The mission of the Economic Development Research Program (EDRP) is to assist local communities by providing affordable economic development and policy research to enhance their competitive positions.

Highlighted Projects



City of Rossville Strategic Priorities (2019)


- Goal: prioritize projects that will bring greater investment into the city based on its strengths, real and tourism estate assets, and proximity to regional economic hubs.
- Tasks: community assessment, stakeholder and state partner interviews, SWOT analysis, a review of recent studies, and direction for the community to leverage its federal opportunity zone (OZ) designation.
- **Result:** Received Rural Zone designation from DCA. Community leaders gained a better understanding of how to prioritize recommendations for economic growth.

Washington County Workforce Analysis (2018)

- Goal: evaluate the jobs available to the community, the skills held by members of the labor force, and the skills and training required by the county's focus industries.
- Tasks: assess workforce supply and demand through analysis of demographic data, commuting patterns, and industry and occupation data.
- **Result:** Provided community with recommendations for workforce development and retention, industry engagement, educational partnerships, and community development.

Primary Criteria for Selection





Some **financial commitment from the community** is required. Local funding extends our resources so more can be done and ensures the community is committed.

Who is Eligible to Apply?



Communities or economic development organizations in Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida are eligible for the program.
